

Summary 3.11 についてのオーラルナラティブ研究成果をアーカイブ化する。既に東北の 10 ヶ所の地域でインタビューを実施し、400 時間以上のデータを保有しているので、今後はこのデータを研究材料としてより活用できるものへと発展させるべく、談話分析、災害科学、社会学等という見解から分析していく。この分析しデータベース化したサイトを希望データベースと呼ぶ。

## 1. 研究の目的及び背景; This research is

- a. 1. Phase I (Basic Research in data collection) create an archive of oral narrative research about 3.11, based on almost 400 hours of digital video interviews that have already been collected from more than 10 different communities in Tohoku.
- b. 2. Phase II (Basic Research in archival creation); we will edit, index and curate this rich and growing archive—everyday people talking about their life in their own words before and since 3.11.
- c. Phase III (scholarly output) Once the archive is curated, our own team will conduct scholarly research on 1) oral discourse analysis of 3.11, 2) disaster ethnography, 3)science/technology/society, and 4) social movements.
- d. Phase IV (Data sharing to fellow scholars) In order to maximize the impact of this data, we will make this archive of primary data research available to university research institutes in fully coded and searchable databases.
- e. Phase V (Data sharing to public at large) To the general society in easy-to-use 希望データベース.
- 2. Current progress. Our completely bilingual team will provide both Japanese transcriptions and English translations to ensure this important story of Japan during 3.11 is available as widely as possible.
